

SUIKEIEN IAPANESE GARDEN

Suikeien is a garden which boasts a beautiful pond, called Nagatani Pond. It is an abundant reservoir characterized by its many waterfowl and refreshing breezes, and also features a waterfall crashing down dynamically.

The brilliant colors of the surrounding maple leaves are complemented by the calming sounds of the garden's numerous cascades.





SHIKEIEN

Suikeien is located in Keihanna Commemorative Park in the center of the Keihanna Science City, which is a Japanese National Project, Suikeien was founded through a collective effort by the Kyoto landscape gardening industry to commemorate 1200 years since the relocation of the Japanese capital to Heian-kyo (modern-day Kyoto). It is renowned for its beauty as well as its scale, the latter of which represents the modern Japanese garden.

SAGANAKA COTTON MUSEUM

(Suikeien Kangetsuro Basement)

Saganaka cotton goods were a famous product of Saganakamura (present-day Saganaka in Kizugawa) in southern Kyoto Prefecture from the early Meiji period to the second decade of the Showa period. The museum features cotton exhibits

and weaving demonstrations. A hands-on workshop for making cotton goods is also available upon reservation.

Enjoyfeeding beautiful colored carp. Carp food is available for 50 yen.



A nature-Filled garden perfect for going on walks. The garden allows visitors to enjoy the beautiful harmony of mankind and nature from different distances and angles.


Budding Tree Forest


Rock Cluster

One of the largest cluster of rocks in Japan. It is made up of approximately 500 rocks, each of up to 70 tons in weight, made from a type of granite called sabimikage The rocks are all brought in from Inushima, Okayama Prefecture.



Moon Viewing Bridge

This latticed bridge measures 10m high 123m long, and 4m wide. The elevated position allows visitors to enjoy the garden from above.

Maple Valley

Over a hundred maple trees planted beside waterfalls and ponds by Kyoto's expert landscape architects make for a stunningly four seasons.



Suikeidana Cascades

One of the largest group of garden waterfalls in Japan, these are connected in a basin resembling terraced rice Fields.

The stepping stones in the water allow visitors to see the cascades up close.
